United States Elin Suleymanov, Minister of Agriculture Inam Karimov, and many more representatives with both the U.S. and Azerbaijan.

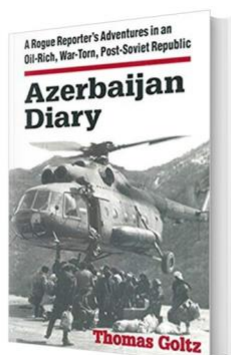
