

Armenians killed 1,000, Azeris charged

 BAKU, Azerbaijan - Azerbaijan charged yesterday that Armenian militants massacred men, women and children after forcing them from a town in Nagorno-Karabakh last week.

Azerbaijan officials said 1,000 Azeris had been killed in the town of Khojaly and that Armenian fighters threw dead men, women and children from snow-covered rooftops.

Armenian officials disputed the death toll and denied the massacre report. Journalists in the town said it was difficult to say exactly how many people had been killed in surrounding areas. But a Russian photographer said he saw two trucks filled with Azeri corpses, and a Russian journalist reported massive bloodstains in the area.

Azeri officials and journalists who flew briefly to the region by helicopter mourned the bodies of three dead children who had been shot in the head, sources said, but Armenian protesters there from recovering from the town.

In the Azerbaijani capital of Baku, government officials said that communications with Khojaly, the last Azeri holdout in Nagorno-Karabakh, were cut yesterday morning. The militant Azerbaijan Popular Front reported that Armenian troops backed by armor and artillery were moving closer to the town. Khojaly was shelled again overnight, according to someone speaking to the press yesterday.
